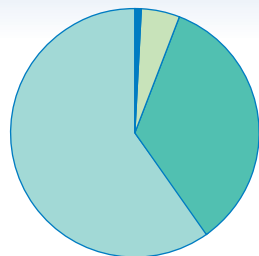

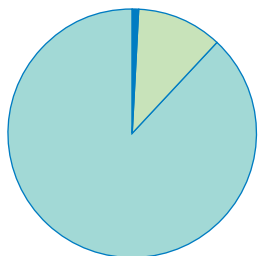


Revenue Source
